



BROOKLANDS MUSEUM

Thursday July 14th. 2022

Brooklands was the birthplace of British motorsport and aviation. The first purpose-built racing track in the world was built here in 1907, by the local landowner Hugh Locke-King. Many aviation firsts took place on this site and it became one of Britain's first aerodromes.

This museum has an original aircraft factory, is the home of Concorde and the London Bus Museum. Our visit will commence with a 1hr. guided tour of the area (excluding the London Bus Museum).

The museum houses many classic racing cars such as the 24-litre Napier-Railton, motor cycles, bicycles and the London Bus Museum. Plenty for all classic transport enthusiasts to explore and envy at those who had the privilege to drive these classics.

You will be able to explore the aircraft factory floor with its fascinating exhibits. About 19,000 aircraft were built here between 1908-1984.



Also, we will have a 35 min. tour of Concorde. Sitting in real Concorde passenger seats, we will experience a virtual take-off flight.

There is a café on site for refreshments.
